The Judges of the Columbiana County Municipal Court hereby adopt the following as an addition to, and amendment of, Rule 6 of the Local Rules of the court effective as of May 1, 2017:

## 6. Probation Supervision Fee.

A probation supervision fee of shall be charged for each person placed upon probation in accordance with the following schedule:

For Basic Supervision (no ordered community service or drug/alcohol screens)

One year --

Two Hundred Dollars (\$200)

Two or more years --

Three Hundred Dollars (\$300)

For Intensive Supervision (ordered community service or drug/alcohol screens)

One year --

Three Hundred Dollars (\$300)

Two or more years --

Four Hundred Dollars (\$400)

For Delayed Payment of Fines and Costs:

Any person who is not on Basic or Intensive Probation who is placed on a delayed payment plan, shall be charged at the rate of Ten Dollars \$10 per month on the first of each month as a monitoring fee.

Persons placed on probation or on a payment plan prior to May 1, 2017 shall have fees imposed in accordance with the Court Rule in effect at that time.

Separate fees shall be charged for the actual costs of any drug/alcohol tests administered.

Early termination of probation shall not result in a refund of any probation fees. Failure to pay any fee shall be considered a violation of the Court order and shall be subject to charges for indirect contempt of court or probation violation. All fees collected under this section shall be paid to the clerk of court and shall be placed in a separate fund to be disbursed upon an order of the court. If the Court determines that the amount of money

in the fund is more than the amount sufficient to satisfy the purpose for which the fee was imposed, the court may declared surplus in the fund and expend the surplus money for other appropriate expenses of the court.
