In addition, there shall be added to the Court Costs in an OVI Case (TRUCK Case) 2017 sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) in each case where a defendant is convicted of an OVI offense occurring on or after April 6, 2017, which shall be disbursed as follows:



- State Habitual OVI Offenders registry \$ 2.50
- Columbiana County Special Projects \$ 2.50


In setting the Special Projects amounts above, the undesignated judges have determined that, for the efficient operation of the court, additional funds are necessary to acquire and pay for special projects of the court including, but not limited to, the acquisition of additional facilities or the rehabilitation of existing facilities, the acquisition of equipment, the hiring and training of staff, community service programs, mediation or dispute resolution services, the employment of magistrates, the training and education of judges, acting judges, and magistrates, and other related services.

In addition, the judges have determined and order that to the extent that the Special Projects fees in Criminal and Traffic cases may exceed those fees charged in Civil and other cases, these excess amounts may only be used for Special Projects related to Criminal and Traffic matters, including programs administered by the Court's Probation Department.
